A challenge for champions

A new black run sees the light of day this winter, future setting of the 2023 Alpine Skiing World Championships. Do you dare tackle it?

With a length of 3.3km and a 970m drop, it offers adventurous skiing on one of the longest runs in the ski area. Set in the heart of the forest, it offers a bird's-eye view over the traditional village of Courchevel Le Praz, the Olympic ski jumps and l'Alpinium.

What is it like? It's challenging and technical because of its transitions from light to shade - it's a whole new concept!

Sharpen your skis and your wits and discover this soon-to-be-legendary run, whose name remains a secret for the moment!

More comfort for our clients

New: Bouquetin — a new chairlift replaces the Plattières 3 gondola





We say "Adieu" to the vintage little bubbles of Plattières 3, and 'Bienvenue" to the new Bouquetin chairlift! No more removing and carrying your skis and packing tightly into the gondolas: you can now make yourself comfortable on the new, 6-seater Bouquetin chairlift and admire its magnificent views. It will only take you 2¹⁶ minutes to reach the summit and access the Saint-Martin de Belleville or Les Menuires slopes.

The chairlift can also be used by non-skiers in both directions. Remember to hold on tight for the descent – some people may find the drop into the Bouquetin couloir a hair-raising experience!

New Roc de Fer tunnel



Méribel aims to take advantage of hosting the 2023 Alpine Skiing World Championships by carrying out improvements that will benefit everyone in the future. One such success is the Roc de Fer tunnel, which will allow you to fully enjoy the ski area even when major competitions are being held! It's a big improvement on the former narrow tunnel: it's 50m long, 8.50m wide and 5m high. Thanks to this new structure, throughout the season competitors will have sole use of an internationally renowned piste, while all other skiers can easily enjoy the splendid Roc de Fer sector with its legendary runs and fabulous views over the valley.

New: Footbridge at le Raffort hamlet



Following on from the major developments to enhance the Roc de Fer and Cherferie sectors over the past 3 years, we welcome a new footbridge which will greet skiers arriving at le Raffort hamlet in Méribel! It will be safer and easier to use for skiers arriving on the "Raffort" piste, local residents and skiers returning to Bridesles-Bains. What a pleasure not to have to descend and climb lots of steps to reach the Olympe gondola, which is now directly accessible from the slopes! It's yet another reason to explore this sector and rediscover its 2 new red slopes, Daguet and Gypaète, which proved a big hit last year.

In freeride mode

New: Vertical Xperience, Les 3 Vallées' steepest runs

Are you ready to tackle the two steepest black runs in les 3 Vallées, with an average gradient of 33° and the steepest section at 38.6°? If the prospect doesn't make you white with fear, make your way to the top of the legendary Saulire and try out the Grand Couloir and Couloir Tournier runs - thrills are guaranteed!





Freeride Lab takes the freeride experience even further

Courchevel's secure freeride area continues to grow, to the delight of off-piste fans: a new Avalanche Transceiver Park has been created at the foot of the two secure, ungroomed Freeride Lab runs. After a 15-minute climb to the summit, a photo session in front of the wood sculpture and a magical descent in powder, you can then practise searching for avalanche victims. Using your own equipment, you can search for transmitters buried in the snow: you choose the number of victims to look for and the time limit. Your safety is our priority and training can save lives, so use this zone as often as you like!



Take a break

Chill out on the slopes

There's a new relaxation area on the slopes, the perfect place for a snack or to rest your legs between runs, and where you can enjoy a picnic or simply take the time to soak up the mountain atmosphere.

At Courchevel Moriond, a tranquil plateau overlooking the Dolomitelike Brêche de la Portetta has been fitted out for your enjoyment. As well as picnic tables, you'll find giant wooden deckchairs where you can enjoy a unique break on a high point – it's worth going out of your way to find. Admire the beauty of the mountains and breathe in the pure air... you deserve it after this extraordinary year!

After years of loyal service, the trail is getting a fresh new look, but with the same aim of delighting children. This green slope is fun and educational, transforming young skiers into explorers in search of les 3 Vallées' animals. Use all 5 senses to recognize ibex, chamois and marmots by their footprints, calls or fur. The Animal Trail is also accessible on foot via a walking path that runs alongside it – it's the perfect place for family time together!

Runs worth rediscovering

There's more to life than new things! This season, take the time to discover les 3 Vallées afresh by changing your habits and getting off the beaten track. Here are some insiders' secret 3 Vallées runs.

Jerusalem run: landscape & history

This blue slope is one not to miss, thanks to its breathtaking landscape and peaceful descent to Saint-Martin de Belleville. Admire the view from the 2,400m summit of Tougnète: the Méribel and Belleville valleys lay before you! Then enjoy excellent snow on a beautiful, gently rolling run that takes you to Saint-Martin de Belleville, a traditional 3 Vallées village.



Did you know?

During the Second World War, this region was a hotbed of French Resistance. The local residents came to the aid of many of the war's victims, hiding them from the Germans in their "montagnettes", the alpine chalets lining the piste. That is why it's called Jerusalem. Today it is a place of pilgrimage and site of historical interest.

La Lory: gentle with wide open spaces

On the Orelle side of the mountain, la Lory is a superb blue run which invites skiers to admire the scenery. Come and enjoy its gentle, rolling slopes - it's accessible to all, young or old, from the top of the Funitel de Thorens. The run takes its name from the Pierre Lory pass between the Bouchet and Chavière glaciers, meaning you will pass through a glacial valley ... pure magic!

Dame Blanche: discreet & surprising

Tucked away on the slopes of la Masse in les Menuires is the Dame Blanche black run. This offers a superb panorama over the Vallon du Lou, Les Menuires, Val Thorens and the Péclet massif. Discover this little-used run by taking la Masse draglift, and enjoy the unique sensation of being alone in the world, admiring the incredible landscapes. The gradient is ideal; relatively uniform but with interesting variations in terrain. It is also a departure point for the Vallon du Lou for experienced off-piste skiers.

Boismint: a peaceful, long descent

This strategically located sector, between the Vallon du Lou and the Combe de Caron, has fantastic views over the valley! To the right is the imposing Péclet massif, to the left is the Belleville valley and opposite is the Mont Blanc. Here you'll find 1,000m of vertical drop on a red run with a constant gradient, perfect for carving. Top tip: choose this area in the morning to make the most of its sunshine and impeccable grooming.

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
